Did you know?

UNISON is recognised by all 21 colleges in the East Midlands? We have seats on negotiating forums where these exist, and UNISON can represent all staff on “support” contracts.

Each year, UNISON holds an annual conference purely for staff members working in the sector. We have a national committee, with two seats for East Midlands reps.

Latest East Midlands news headlines...

Like many other regions, the East Midlands is concentrating help to members facing mergers of colleges or redundancy exercises.

West Notts College, Mansfield Some 85 full-time equivalent (FTE) staff are being made redundant. Although joint campaigning has reduced the original number down from 100, the job cuts have equally hit lecturers and support staff. The employer blames a change on government policy about apprenticeship funding. UNISON has equally blamed poor financial decisions by the college, and the reliance on apprenticeships as its core business model.

Nottingham College The merger of the former Clarendon and New College Nottingham colleges does not appear to be good news for staff or students. We are now in a third round of redundancies in 12 months and UNISON has been critical of the colleges consultation processes.

Stephenson College and Loughborough College Stephenson College has withdrawn all courses

from Nottingham, blaming competition from the newly merged Nottingham College and the cost of its building leases in the city. Just as staff were breaking for the summer, Loughborough and Stephenson Colleges announced they were considering options of a possible merger and UNISON awaits an outcome later this year.

Lincoln College At least 18 jobs at risk, but local UNISON reps concerned other restructures or cuts may be threatened next academic year

Changes are happening in most of our colleges, and so now is the ideal time to get active in UNISON so we can all support each other (luckily, just how a union is designed to work!).

East Midlands network event, Wednesday 3 October 2018

Clearly, this is a time of massive change for out FE and Sixth Form members. As part of UNISON campaigns against job cuts and mergers, we are planning to hold a ‘network’ event for members. This will be held in Leicester on Weds 3 October.

More details inside. This is an ideal opportunity to bring together our reps from across the region, and extend an invite to members too. We will have learning sessions and aim to devise a strategy of support for our members — and it is support staff that bear the brunt of attacks on jobs, terms, and pensions. **Why not get involved and sign up to this event?**

STOP PRESS! Pay Claim for 2018/2019

In July, UNISON and UCU submitted a pay claim to the Association of Colleges for either a 5% or £1500 increase (underpinned by a minimum Living Wage Foundation rate of pay). The AoC has responded with a 5% pay offer (but over 2 years), and dependent on government funding to pay for it. See www.unison.org.uk/education

Reasons why your colleagues should join UNISON #1

Employment tribunal fees were scrapped after **UNISON** won a landmark court victory against the government in July 2017 when the Supreme Court (the UK's highest court) unanimously ruled that the government acted unlawfully and unconstitutionally when it introduced the fees.



Following the verdict, anyone who has been treated illegally or unfairly at work will no longer have to pay to take their employers to court – as a direct result of the **UNISON** legal challenge.

UNISON general secretary Dave Prentis said: "When ministers introduced fees they were showing little concern for employees seeking justice following illegal treatment at work. We'll never know how many people missed out because they couldn't afford the expense of fees. But at last this tax on justice has been lifted."

The decision marked the end of a four-year fight by **UNISON** to overturn the government's introduction of fees. So without member like you being in UNISON, all workers would still be faced with these fees. Well done UNISON, the only union to challenge these fees and **WIN**.
