OPEN UNIVERSITY AWARDS

Open University (OU) Awards are available to UNISON members undertaking 30 and 60 point OU courses up to and including undergraduate level at their own expense. No awards are available for Masters Degree study or above.

Awards are made as follows:

- 60 point courses £120
- 30 point courses £60

Awarded on a first-come, first-served basis until funds are exhausted. Available on 1 January and 1 September each year.

UNISON Educational Bursaries, book grants

Are you undertaking trade union studies, or vocational studies related to public service employment, or any kind of non-vocational study (including GCSE's or leisure courses)? You may be eligible for a UNISON study *Book Grant*.

These grants of approximately £70 are intended to help members who are undertaking study at their own expense, up to and including undergraduate level, on the following types of courses:

Trade Union and Labour Studies where an applicant has not received a bursary.

Non-vocational education up to and including undergraduate level, e.g. GCSEs, A Levels, Access courses, leisure/recreational courses.

Vocational education relevant to public service work up to and including undergraduate level.

Book grant applications are dealt with on a first come, first served basis until funds are exhausted and are available on 1 January and 1 September each year. Book grants are not available for Masters Degree study or above.

Dyslexia. More common than you think

Dyslexia is big news for UNISON and we are committed to raising awareness about Dyslexia and helping members to access help and support.

What is Dyslexia?

It is estimated that 1 in 10 of the population are affected by dyslexia to some degree.

Dyslexia is a combination of abilities and difficulties that affect the learning process in one or more of reading, spelling and writing. It is a persistent condition. There is no cure, but with the right specialist support and teaching, people with dyslexia can overcome their difficulties and achieve great things!

People with dyslexia have particular strengths as well as difficulties. Many are often very creative, lateral thinkers, with the ability to express themselves well verbally.

UNISON offers free courses and sessions on dyslexia. Union Learning Reps can attend specialist training on dyslexia, how it can prevent people from getting the best from learning, and how to help overcome these barriers.
